Health & Wellbeing

The Health and Wellbeing Core Group has worked hard throughout the year to represent the Church in Harlow in the key areas of Health and Wellbeing for our town.

We decided soon after the lockdown was announced, to join with statutory, charity and community groups to support a joint approach to supporting the most vulnerable within Harlow through the Covid 19 Community Hub. It was pleasing to see a number of folk from churches around the town volunteering to support people.

We have been represented at a number of meetings to help address the needs of the town including:-

- · Supporting those housed in Permitted Development Rights (PDR) properties
- The COVID 19 response
- The plans for the new Hospital
- · The Voluntary Sector Forum
- The One Health and Care Partnership
- · The Health and Wellbeing Partnership Board.

We have developed a web-page specifically to keep people updated about <u>Health &</u> <u>Wellbeing issues.</u>

Looking forward to the coming year, we have been working with the Dementia Action Alliance in Harlow to see how the Churches can better support those with Dementia and their Carers and the first awareness session for Church Leaders and Pastoral Team Leaders is on Thursday 28th January.

We are also exploring with Kintsugi Hope the potential for beginning groups to support those experiencing mental health issues, and our first Forum of 2021 on the 18th May, will have this as a main topic.


The Heart4Harlow prayer meeting facilitated by Jane Carrington moved online. We have

Arts, Culture, Education & Sport

The "ACES" core group has met several times over the year, mainly via Zoom, to pray, share and celebrate what is happening in the world of arts, culture, education, and sport in our local community. The



focus of our meetings has mainly been education – although we now have great contacts with those involved in the arts and sport so hopefully the focus next year will include these aspects.

We have discussed the impact of the Great Open Door group and prayed for their amazing endeavours throughout the year. Great Open Door have sent two presentations to school for electronic viewing and this has been very well received by the schools and enabled the ongoing relationship between Great Open Door and local schools to continue and to deepen. We have also focused on the work of the Gideons – now known as Good News for Everyone – and have been praying that they will be allowed into every secondary school in Harlow as soon as possible.

We have also prayed for and encouraged the Harlow Holiday Lunch Clubs / Boxes of Hope initiative which has had and is continuing to have a massive impact on vulnerable families throughout the town.

We have decided to pray specifically for a small group of schools at each meeting so that over the course of the year every school is covered in prayer.
