


One of the most powerful features of Bridge Base Online (BBO) is the ability to review and replay every bid and every card that has been played. This guide will show you how to do this. Not only can you see how you did against other players around the world, you can use Bridge Solver Online to determine the best possible plays for each hand that is dealt. If you are not familiar with Bridge Solver Online, I have written a guide for the Vanderbilt Bridge Club, dated July 6, 2018, which is available on the Vanderbilt Bridge Club website: https://www.bridgewebs.com/vanderbilt/Bridge%20Solver%20Online.pdf.

Reviewing your results

When playing casual bridge in the BBO Main Bridge Club, you can see how you are doing and what other tables did *while you are logged in*. This guide focuses on reviewing your results <u>after you have completed</u> <u>a session</u>. Use your browser (Chrome, Edge, Safari) and go to https://www.bridgebase.com/







If you do not wish to run Chrome as your browser, skip to the next section.

Install the Bridge Solver extension for Chrome on PC, Mac, and Chromebook

Download and install google chrome from the google website if necessary. In the chrome browser visit this page in the chrome web store and click on the "Add To Chrome" button.

This extension works through Bridge Solver Online and therefore relies on an active internet connection.


Once the extension has been installed, to acquire hands from a supported type of bridge results page simply navigate to the results page in the chrome browser. When this extension has detected a page containing one or more bridge hands, the bridge solver icon at the right hand side of the address bar changes to a green background. Clicking on the icon will then launch Bridge Solver Online in a new browser tab and upload the hand(s) to it. If no bridge hands are detected on the results page the icon shows a white background. Clicking on the icon in this case brings up a web page inviting the user to input a hand or browse to a PBN, DLM, or bridge base online LIN file stored on their computer.

Also, clicking on a download link for a PBN, DLM, or bbo LIN file will download the file and then load it into Bridge Solver Online.


Run Bridge Solver Online on your BBO .LIN Files without Chrome


If you would like to run the Bridge Solver Online application on one of your downloaded BBO .LIN files from a different browser, such as Microsoft Edge or Apple Safari, follow these instructions:

Start your browser and click the following link: https://mirgo2.co.uk/bridgesolver/upload.htm This window will be displayed:




Once the Bridge Solver online screen displays, the instructions are the same regardless of the browser. **★**52





Close that screen and go back to the BBO Bridge Club Hands and click on the "Traveller" link.



This brings up the traveler of the 16 tables who played this same hand. Your result is highlighted in yellow.

You can click on the "Movie" link by other results and see how the bidding went and how they played the hand. It can be very informative to see how other players reached contracts and results!
